

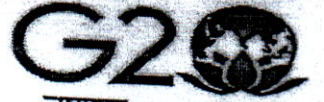

This is with reference to the proposal submitted by M. E. S. College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Bangalore, affiliated to Bengaluru City University, Karnataka, for the conferment of autonomous status.

The Commission, in its meeting held on 30.01.2026, has approved the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Autonomous Colleges to confer the autonomous status upon M. E. S. College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Bangalore – 560003, affiliated to Bengaluru City University, Karnataka, for a period of 10 years from the academic year 2026-27 to 2035-36, as per clause 7.5 of the UGC (Conferment of Autonomous Status Upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2023.

The University is, therefore, requested to issue the necessary notification within 30 days regarding the conferment of autonomous status to the College as per the above-mentioned UGC Regulations. The autonomous college is required to comply with all provisions of the UGC Regulations for Autonomous Colleges, 2023. The Regulations are available on www.ugc.gov.in. Non-compliance with the requirements and conditions prescribed in the said Regulations shall attract action under Clause 13 of the UGC Regulations, 2023. The college shall apply to the University Grants Commission for an extension of autonomous status at least three months before the completion of the period of autonomy.

Report of the Expert Committee to verify the eligibility of M.E.S College of Arts,
Commerce and Science for Grants of Autonomous Status

Preamble:-

The Principal of MES College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Bengaluru has submitted the proposal along with the UGC letter No.F.2-10/2023(AC-Policy) dated. 06th March, 2026 conferring the Autonomous Status to M.E.S. College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Bengaluru for a period of 10 years from the academic year 2026-27 to 2035-36.

The University Grants Commission has accorded the Autonomous Status as per the UGC (Conferment of Autonomous Status upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards of Autonomous Colleges) Regulations-2023. However, Section 64 of the Karnataka State Universities Act state that:

64(1) “Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations made there-under, the University may, with the prior concurrence of the State Government designate for such period as may be specified, an affiliated college, department or units as an Autonomous College for any course of study, after following the procedure and subject to such conditions as may be specified in the Statutes made in this behalf and with a view to improve the quality of education and to introduce new and relevant courses of study”.

As per the above provisions concurrence of the State Government is mandatory. In a similar case the Govt. has asked the University to send an Expert Committee to verify the infrastructure and other academic facilities available in the College for conferring Autonomous Status. Accordingly, the following Expert Committee under the Chairmanship of Vice-Chancellor is constituted.

Examination reforms

- A system of bar coding of Register Numbers has been introduced to maintain confidentiality and to eliminate the manual procedure of coding and decoding.
- Bar coding of marks has also been introduced for both theory and practical examinations. The valuer, after valuation pastes the marks sticker on the valued paper. This can be directly scanned into the computer. This eliminates any possible manual error.

- a. Physical verification of valued answer scripts to rectify totaling errors. This has led to a reduction in the number of students applying for re-valuation.
- Unused sheets from the answer books are detached after the entire examination process is completed and is re-used leading to reduction in paper wastage and leading to conservation of environment.
- All the examination procedures are completely computerized.
 - Online Admission ticket download
 - Entry of Marks by scanning of register number and the marks barcode
 - Tabulation of Results and consolidated result sheet for publication.
 - Result analysis: Course wise, Combination wise and subject wise.
 - Statement of Marks with credits and grade points.
 - Statement of Marks with photographs on non-tear able paper and security features with 11 to ensure that tampering is not done.
 - Consolidated marks sheet with CGPA
- b. Two sets of question papers are set for each subject. One set by the internal examiner and the other one is by an external examiner. Paper setters should have a minimum of five years of teaching experience.
- c. There is only single valuation for UG Courses. The valuation is partly internal and partly external. 10% of the valued papers are reviewed by the external examiners. Valuers should have a minimum of three years of teaching experience.
- d) There is double valuation for PG courses. The internal & external paper setters do the valuation. The average of the two valuers is taken as the final mark. When there is a difference of more than 15% the paper will be sent for third valuation and the marks awarded by the third valuer is final.
 - a) **Is question paper setting for final examination (internal / external/ combined) are as per norms : Yes**

Two sets of question papers are set for each subject. One set by the internal examiner and the other one is by the external examiner. Paper setters should have a minimum of five years of teaching experience.

- b) **Is evaluation completely internal / completely external/ partly external and partly internal and are as per norms**

For UG programmes, there is only single valuation. The valuation is partly internal and partly external in cases where internal valuers are not available. 10% of the valued papers are reviewed by the external examiners. For PG programmes, there is double valuation- one internal and the other external. The average of the two marks is taken as the final mark. When there is a difference of more than 15% the paper is valued by a third valuer and the marks awarded by the third valuer is final.
